

The Pupil Premium is additional funding to help schools close the gap between children from low income households and other disadvantaged circumstances and their peers. The funding is calculated by the number of children on school roll registered for free school meals (FSM), Looked after Children or whose parents are serving in the armed forces. In the financial year 2017/18 the school received an additional £213,500 which was spent on the following provision:

- Additional daily teaching groups.
- Higher Level Teaching Assistant to support intensive catch-up programmes.
- One to One tuition.
- Volunteer Reading Scheme.
- Summer School.
- Extended school provision supporting social interaction and engagement.
