Free Asymptomatic Testing for Parents and Carers

The government are offering regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing for asymptomatic parents and other adults in households with children at school. This is a voluntary initiative and is available to adults in childcare and support bubbles with school children too.

Children of primary school age (and younger) without symptoms are **NOT** being asked to take these regular tests.

Along with the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings and maintaining social distancing, NHS Test and Trace have said that undertaking regular coronavirus testing helps reduce transmission of the virus.

The tests are fast, easy to use and completely free. They are designed to be undertaken at home, twice weekly. Test kits can be obtained:

- through employers, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting home test kits from a local test site anyone aged 18 or over can collect two packs • of 7 tests (enough for 7 weeks)
- by ordering a home test kit online. You are asked to only order online if you cannot access testing • kits through the other two routes.
