What We Have Been Doing

This week in Nursery we have been talking about firework safety and why we see fireworks at night time. We hope the children have been sharing our discussions with you.

The *Reception* children have settled back really guickly after the half term break and have enjoyed telling us about what they got up to. Thank you if you posted any of your travels on Tapestry. This week we have had a Vet come and talk to the children about how to look after pets and what their job entails. They even got to have a go at checking their own toy pets and bandaging them. In Literacy we have started a new book that links with Autumn

and the children have been discussing what clothes they need to wear as the weather gets colder. In maths we have been comparing quantities and identifying which container holds the most. Please be reminded to send back consent forms and money for our trip to Windsor Castle which is now only a week away; we are still quite a few consent forms missing. Aliens landed in the <u>Year 1</u> garden! On Tuesday we used our investigation skills to search for clues about the mystery objects we had discovered. We spotted lots of yellow footprints around the school and used our prediction skills to say what we thought had happened. We have found out



that the crash site was caused by the character from our new book, Beegu. In history we have also found out that teddy bears were named after the American President, Theodore Roosevelt. The children sorted different historical images into true and false piles and had to give reasons for their answers.

Year 2 began a new topic about the Great Fire of London. Everybody was involved and enjoyed the workshop led by the theatre company. We have thought about the differences between fiction and non-fiction writing and have begun to gather facts about the Great Fire. After our exciting trip to Wagamamas, we have continued to talk about healthy eating



in science. We started using a Publisher program on our laptops and produced firework pictures using different tools and we used real paint too. We all loved the taster golf session today and a leaflet with information about this is in book bags today.
