## Heathfield's Healthy Lunch Idea of the week

This week why not have a go at creating something new and healthy for your lunch box!

### Pea Hummus with Pitta Bread and Veggie Sticks

#### **Hummus Ingredients**

200g cooked peas  
1 garlic clove, crushed  
1 tbsp tahini  
squeeze of lemon  
1 tbsp cooked cannellini beans, from a can  
2 tbsp olive oil

Serve with strips of pitta bread and raw vegetable sticks

#### **Method**

Blitz all the ingredients together using a hand blender or food processor. Add 1-2 tbsp water, then blitz again. Transfer a portion to a pot and add to a lunchbox with pitta bread strips and veg sticks. Keep the rest chilled for up to 3 days.
