This year I am getting into football and one thing about football is that you need to train and parkrun is one way you can do that. And that is why I got into parkrun and now I love it! I am trying to get below 8 minutes (for the 2 kilometres run) by the end of the year."

The guinea pigs also came for a week's holiday and the children learnt


