#### What We Have Been Doing



This week in <u>Nursery</u> we have been taking part in 'World Nursery Rhyme' week, singing a different nursery rhyme each day. These will be on Tapestry for you to enjoy and sing along at home. The children have really enjoyed this and have been developing their number knowledge, language and literacy skills.

Next week we will be looking at space, planets, the moon and the earth and will read the story 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. Can we please remind parents as the weather is turning colder, if your child is bringing in extra items such as hats and gloves, please name them all, to help us find them if they are lost. In addition, for safety reasons, we ask the children not to wear scarves as they can get caught and tangled during play and could cause injury.

The <u>Reception</u> children had an amazing time at Windsor Castle last Friday, from seeing the guards, looking at 'Queen Mary's Doll House', to finding the '5 naughty dragons' around the state apartments. All of the children were exceptionally well behaved and were fascinated by the fact that, because the standard flag was flying, somewhere in the castle was the Queen! If you have not yet looked at Tapestry there are some photos of our trip for you to see. This week was 'National Nursery Rhyme' Week so we have been posting our newly learnt rhymes on Tapestry for you. In maths we have been working out what is 1 more and 1 less than a number as well as consolidating our number recognition to 10. If you have any empty cardboard boxes, cereal boxes, plastic bottle lids or tubes, please can you send them into school so we can use them in our junk modelling.

In maths <u>Year 1</u> have been using dienes to represent 'teen' numbers. The children have loved singing along to this song: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xrg3eHSYMFg&safe=active">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xrg3eHSYMFg&safe=active</a>
In English we have created aliens and their settings in preparation for writing alien stories next week. We have also used a 'zone of intensity' to decide if vocabulary is powerful enough to use in our writing. In Art we have been focussing on the artist 'Kandinsky'. We have looked at some of his paintings and answered questions about them. We used different sized paintbrushes to paint shapes and lines using primary colours. The children have had their second PE specialist gymnastic lessons. They learnt lots of different balances and how to link them into a sequence using a travelling move. These lessons take place on a Monday morning so please make sure all children have their PE kit in school every day.

This week <u>Year 2</u> have applied their knowledge of money by adding amounts together and finding change. We realised that our written formal methods can be applied when adding and subtracting money, as well as when we are solving number sentences. In English and history we continued our studies about 'The Great Fire of London' and completed our fact files and shared what we learnt. Using drama to understand how characters felt during the different stages of the fire, we wrote a diary entry in the style of Samuel Pepys. We looked at paintings from the 'Great Fire' period to see what we could learn from them, and how reliable they were. The children were fantastic at recalling the key facts and are beginning to understand that our lives now are very different. Finally, in science, the children continued their understanding of how to keep our bodies healthy and organised different foods into food groups. Ask your child to share what they have learnt about this.

We are hoping to start our DT project soon where we will be creating houses in the style of 1666. If you have any spare shoe boxes or cereal boxes at home please send them in so we can begin our creations. The weather is turning a lot colder now, so please ensure that your child wears a warm coat to school, clearly labelled with their name.

#### **School Attendance**

We have two dedicated Welfare Officers that are on hand to check on the wellbeing of all children.

If your child has a cough, cold and/or sore throat, they can usually manage in school. If symptoms became worse they would be seen by one of our Welfare Officers and a call would be made home.

We have lots of tissues and hand sanitiser within school to keep bugs at bay. Most importantly, we have lots of supportive staff who will help monitor the children through the day.
