## Attendance and Reporting Absence

Please be reminded that all children should have an attendance rate above 95% for each school year. It is worth remembering that a year has 365 days, a school year has 190 days which leaves 175 days to spend on family time, visits, holidays, shopping, household jobs and other appointments:

- If a child has 95% attendance, this still equates to nearly two weeks absence in a year.
- If a child has 90% attendance, this equates to almost four weeks absence in a year.
- If a child has 85% attendance, this equates to nearly six weeks absence in a year.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support with attendance and punctuality so far this academic year. If you have any attendance concerns please feel free to continue to talk to your child's class teacher, we are committed to your child's care and welfare and would really appreciate your continued support and co-operation with this.
