The **Reception** children have been enjoying using the new Trim Trail and they are already much more confident at balancing and negotiating the different obstacles than they were at the beginning of the week. They have listened to the whole story of 'Oh No George' and were great at identifying the wrong choices that George had made as well as making suggestions as to how he could say sorry. In maths they have been looking closely at the numbers 4, 5 and 6. See if your child can spot these numbers around the house of if you are out and about. Please can you check your child's clothing to make sure it is named and that you have the right jumpers/cardigans at home and return any that don't belong to you.

What a week! The Year 1 children loved their trip to Chessington and enjoyed seeing lots of different



animals. The children took part in a special workshop where we found out about animals living in a safari landscape. We discovered some animals only eat vegetables and others only eat meat. We held ostrich feathers and got to touch a real ostrich egg. The children

loved the Sea Life Centre and even got to touch a starfish. The children were very well behaved and were a credit to the school.

Year 2 started our week with the new book 'One Day on Our Blue Planet...in the Antarctic'. We used our predicting reading skills to think what the story could be about and then wrote questions we had from an image. From here the children then sorted adjectives, nouns and verbs and then



wrote some amazing descriptions of what can be found below the icy surfaces. There was some fantastic writing. In maths we have worked on our number bonds to 20 and began to spot

patterns and associated additive relationships. The children worked hard with their partners to explain the patterns and were even able to spot the mistakes. It was very impressive! The children are beginning to learn the skill of hurdling in P.E and were investigating the best way to do this. All the children celebrated National Poetry Day yesterday with the teachers sharing some of their favourite poems and then the children were given the opportunity to become poets themselves. All the children were given their maths homework book this week. This will be due back in on Monday. As part of our reading culture at school, we expect every child to read every night. Please could the person hearing the child read write a comment about the fantastic reading they have heard. Finally, the scooter reply slip and Wagamamas information/contribution is due back no later than Friday 11th October.
