### Best Attendance



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This week <u>Year 1</u> have loved reading about animals in the Amazon rainforest. We enjoyed watching the videos Miss Dearman made when she was travelling through the Amazon and we looked at lots of her photographs too! We have written sentences using verbs and adjectives to describe how the animals move

and what they look like. In maths we are finishing our work on 'Capacity'. We have predicted the capacity of large and small containers and also solved problems using tall and short containers.

This week in <u>Year 2</u> we created our own settings based around the modern version of the book 'Rapunzel' by Bethan Woollvin. We used descriptive language to describe what we saw, heard and felt in the image. We haven't started reading the book yet so we are looking forward to finding out if our \_\_\_\_\_\_ predictions about the book are correct. In maths we have been collecting data and

learning how to put this into tally charts. In science we have also been investigating the question 'Do all children aged 6 and 7 have the same sized feet?'
