
Fairy Tales



The children in Reception have settled really quickly back after the half term break and have told us about places they have been, things they have seen and family they have visited. Thank you if you have put this up on Tapestry; we love finding out what your child's interests are away from school. This term our focus is on 'Fairytales' and we have read the story of 'The Gigantic Turnip'. This has led to discussions about how plants grow and we have even done our own seed planting! Now we have to wait and see what happens. If you have any old garden pots or spades that you no longer need, we would happily take them off your hands. The children are very excited about Book Week next week and our visit from the Image Theatre who will perform Pinocchio. If you have not paid for this yet, please can you send in the money as soon as possible. The production from Image Theatre is really important as it allows the children to see how a performance is put together. At the end of this term, the Reception children will be performing their own Fairy Tale shows for you to come and watch. The dates of the performances are:

Year 1 continued their work on weighing objects. This week they learnt how to solve problems such as "I am thinking of an object, it is lighter than a pen but heavier than a book. What could my object be?". The children used scales and mathematical language to try and investigate the



problems. In English we have started a new book 'One Night Far From Here' by Julia Wauters. We have read lots of books about the animals which live on the African Savannah and have written fact files about an elephant. Why not ask your child what interesting facts they can remember?

Year 2 started their new non-fiction book 'The Moth' by Isabel Thomas and Daniel Egneus. The children have used the text to find out interesting facts about moths and have used these to create fact files. In maths we have been learning to tell the time. By the end of next week your child should be able to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes. Why not practise this at home or you could try the following website to help you:

Book Week - Reading

As well as our Bedtime Stories event next week, we would love to encourage parents and carers to spend extra time reading to their children at home either in the bath, at bedtime, in the car, on the bus or wherever you are. Research shows that reading regularly to children of all ages (even when they are fluent readers themselves) supports their language skills, develops their imagination, helps them to relax and develops a bond between the reader and the child. If you are pushed for time, choose an evening next week when **you read to your child** instead of them reading to you – it might make a nice change!

Internet Safety Message

You may have heard a number of recent issues raised in the media about risks to our children from using the internet and social media platforms, including the recent Momo challenge. We talk regularly to the children about how to stay safe when using the internet, whether on a computer, tablet, games console, phone or other device and ask you to do the same at home. Key messages to reinforce at home with your children are:

- **Keep your personal information and your settings private**
- **Talk to an adult you trust if you come across anything which worries you**
- **Don't arrange to meet someone you have only met online**
- **Never post anything online which would upset someone else.**

In addition to this, we would advise parents to:

- **Monitor what your children are doing online**
- **Check the settings on devices your children use (including your own)**
- **Talk honestly to your children about how to stay safe online, without scaring them**
- **Speak to someone at school if you are concerned that your children are using the internet in an unsafe manner or are being bullied online.**
