
What We Have Been Doing

It has been our last week of reading 'The Naughty Bus' in <u>Reception</u>. On Tuesday we discovered he was missing and had to make 'lost' posters for it. On Wednesday, the Naughty Bus was found, but in a trap. The children did some fantastic writing about how they could get it down. In maths we have been doubling and halving amounts. Thank you for all of the homework photos/passes and buses the children made. We love seeing them.





This week <u>Year 1</u> have made rain makers as part of our English lessons on the book 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. We have loved using them in a drama and dance workshop too. In maths we have started a new topic on fractions. This week we have been focussing on finding half. We have used shapes to look at finding half and are moving on to finding half of a number. To help your child you can keep

practising to double and halve numbers up to 20. Thank you to everyone who sent in baby photos. The children absolutely loved looking at these and were able to answer lots of scientific questions about them. They could talk about the differences and similarities between the photos and what happened to us when we begin to grow.

The <u>Year 2</u> children have been busy this week working on our new visual literacy story 'Once in a Lifetime'. They have written diary entries in role as the airship pilot describing his unusual day. The children used exciting vocabulary, adjectives and adverbs to create fantastic pieces of writing.



In maths the children have been applying their knowledge of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication to solve word problems. The children highlighted the key information in the question to help them identify the number sentence they needed to solve before working out the answer. We have been so impressed with how well the children managed these.

Following last week's lesson on Rosa Parks, this week the children have been learning about Amelia Earhart. We found out that she was the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean solo and the first person ever to fly across the Pacific Ocean. Ask your child what happened to her.
