What We Have Been Doing




This week in <u>Nursery</u> we have been continuing our 'People who help us' topic. The children have been thinking about what jobs they know and what people do to help us. If you would like to come in and talk about your own job please speak to one of the team.

On Thursday next week the children who will be attending our school in September will be visiting Reception for an hour during the session. Nursery times are the same as usual. Can we please ask you all to return library books. Each week there are fewer books being returned making it difficult for children to select new books. If you are unsure of what book your child has taken please let us know so we can check our records.



This week the <u>Reception</u> children have enjoyed looking at different sea creatures linked to our story of 'Hooray for Fish'. They have focused on using 'describing' words to improve their writing.





Our trip to The Wetlands Centre in Barnes was a great success; the children had a great time and were really well behaved. Thank you to all of the parents who came and helped us.



This week in <u>Year 1</u> children have been investigating what happens to gummy bears when you put them in water. The children made predictions and used observation skills throughout the investigation. We have been watching the gummy bears all week and

are surprised by what has happened! Ask your child to tell you all about it. In English we finished reading the book 'Grandad's Island'. The children had lots of thoughts about what happened to him at the end of the story and wrote a brilliant letter about how Syd was feeling once he left.

The children did very well in their phonics assessments and made all the teachers very proud. Well done. We will send out the results to you with your child's report at the end of the term.

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This week in <u>Year 2</u> we have continued reading the book 'Tuesday'. The children wrote their own narratives about what happened to the flying frogs. They then enjoyed writing and illustrating their own sequel about flying pigs.

The children also enjoyed learning about water conservation as a result of the burst water main on Wednesday.



Internet Safety

We would like to remind parents of the importance of ensuring your child is completely risk free whilst using the internet. Please see below on a few ideas on how to teach your child to keep themselves safe online and take the following action yourself:

- Talk to your child about the dangers of using the internet, show an interest in what they are doing and agree your own 'golden rules'.
- Let your child know how important it is to tell you about any suspicious contacts or incidents of cyber bullying so you can take action.
- Teach your child the basic rules of "netiquette", behaving responsibly on the internet and keeping messages polite.
- Let them know what kind of sites they can and can't visit and try to encourage them to only use regulated chat rooms and social networking sites that are designed for their age group.
- Take an interest in their online activities; talk to them about what they are doing, don't let them access then internet unsupervised.
- Contact your internet service provider (for example; BT, Virgin etc) for advice on family security settings and parental controls that can filter internet content, block viruses or spam email to your computer or limit access to certain websites.
- Enforcing the use of the PEGI ratings on games and filmshttp://www.pegi.info/en/index/id/33/Children should only have access to age appropriate content and this also needs to be monitored by an adult.
- > Use a child-friendly search engine such as Safe Search to block out unsuitable websites.
