### What We Have Been Doing

This week in Nursery the children have been really impressing us with their knowledge of people who help us and what things they might use to help them do their job. Our first visitor will be coming to visit us next week. Please look on Tapestry for a record of their visit We will need some resources for our upcoming art project, so if you could start

collecting plastic milk bottle lids of any colour we would really appreciate your contributions, as we will be requiring lots of them.

This week the <u>Reception</u> children have continued the 'Under the Sea' theme and have been reading and discussing a book about Sharks. They have discovered that there are many different types of sharks including Blackbelly Lantern Shark which can make lights shine from its tummy. We have loved seeing all of the different homework about sharks and are always amazed by the children's creativity. Thank you for posting them on Tapestry.

In maths this week we have been looking at counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and seeing that sometimes it's easier to count like this. We hope to see you at the Summer Fair on Saturday.

Aliens crashed landed in the Year 1 garden on Monday. The scene was cordoned off with police tape and the children wrote some exciting investigation reports about what they thought had happened. The children were shocked to find out the alien had made its

way through the school leaving a trail of mysterious yellow dust behind it! The children have loved the beginning of our new story book, 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon and are eager to read more of the story.



This week in science the children have been making bouncing eggs. They observed what happens to eggs when they are put into vinegar. We have made observations of the eggs every day and were amazed at what we found out. Ask your child about whether we managed to turn the eggs into bouncy balls or not? In maths we have been learning to partition numbers into hundreds, tens and ones. Why not play any of these games at home to help your child.

**Junior School:**

As a school we promote healthy, sustainable travel. Parking Enforcement Officers patrol areas around the school entrance intermittently to ensure parents are parking legally and safely. If they find cars parked illegally they will issue fines of up to £60. Please therefore abide to parking restrictions, such as avoiding driveways and yellow lines etc.
