What We Have Been Doing

This week in <u>Nursery</u> we have been focusing on the story of 'Oliver's Vegetables', looking at different foods from around the world and where they grow. We are also really pleased to see how well the children are caring for the plants and mini beasts in our outside area. Next term we will be looking at the topic of 'People who help us' and preparing the children for their move to Reception. Remember to post any visits or experiences on Tapestry during the half term holiday.

This week the <u>Reception</u> children have listened to the end of the story of 'The Everywhere Bear' by Julia Donaldson and have enjoyed empathising with the different characters. They have talked about how they feel when they lose something, how the bear would have felt being lost and whether any of them have been lost. The story also talks about rubbish, so it enabled us to have a good discussion about recycling and what we can do to recycle things at home to help the environment. See how much your children can recycle or make something out of an old unwanted packet at home. In maths we have been continuing to learn our number bonds to 10 and are getting much better at quickly recalling

these facts. Please remember to pay for our trip to the Wetlands Centre and a reminder to send in a P.E. kit for your child. There are still some children who do not have a P.E. kit in school, they will definitely need one next term.

This week the <u>Year 1</u> children have been researching Kenya. We have used books, videos and the internet to find out all about Kenya. We created fact files to show all of the information we found out about the food they eat, clothes they wear, where they live and the languages they speak. In maths we have been finding a quarter of numbers. We

did our own investigation about which numbers we would be able to find a quarter of and which we would not. In art his week we have created African sunsets using paint, chalk and charcoal. We used silhouettes of animals and tress and to add to our creations.

I have attached photos of the <u>Year 2</u> children in the playground. This week's playground craze has been 'spinning plates'. The children have persevered to develop this skill and have enjoyed challenging

themselves! The children have been using the visit from the author Chitra
Soundar to inspire their writing. They have written fantastic book reviews of
Pattan's Pumpkin and retold the story using creative vocabulary. During our





maths lesson we have been focusing on symmetry and the children have created patterns and drawings.

Ask your child if they can tell you what symmetry means. We have been so proud of how hard the children have worked this half term, particularly during their SAT tests which they have completed. Thank you for your
