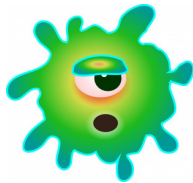
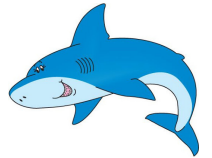


What We Have Been Doing

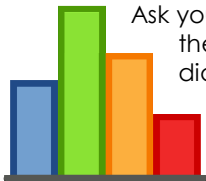


The **Reception** children have had another amazing week. They have continued learning about the different types of shark, the biggest being 12m long and the smallest the size of a chocolate biscuit! We have shared some wonderful knowledge on sharks and the children have been very creative. In maths we have been continuing to count in 2s, 5s and 10s; see if your child can teach you how to count like this at home.



This week in **Year 1** the children have been investigating the germs which grow on our hands. We rubbed our hands on bread and sealed them in plastic bags. Then we cleaned our hands using soap and rubbed them on to the bread. We will be observing the differences we see throughout the week. In English we have finished reading 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon. The children have designed their own aliens from play dough and described them using interesting adjectives.

The children in **Year 2** have had a great week reading and creating their own different types of poems. They have been learning that there are many different types of poems including abecedarius, haiku and free verse. Ask your child if they can remember what each of these are. In maths the children have been using their knowledge of numbers to solve problems this week. They have created bar charts, Venn diagrams and solved word problems.



The children are getting very excited for sports day and we have been practising during P.E. Can you please remember to send in a P.E kit for your child if they don't already have one in school.
