It has been an excellent start to the new term. Your children are delighted to be back at school. They are engaged with their learning and their friends and the school feels busy and purposeful. Thank you for all your support and cooperation in helping us make the beginning of this school year a positive experience for your children. I know it is not quite the same as usual and the control measures do impact on how we run the school, but the new normal is well established and we now know that coronavirus will be with us for some time and how important these measures are. It is now crucial we all follow the rules we have in place so we reduce the risk of spreading the virus and continue to be able to educate the children. This will be done quickly and efficiently, whilst the rest of the school continues as usual. Home learning packs have been prepared for the isolating children should this happen.
