Year 6 Trip to Bushy Park Stockyard

Last Tuesday, Year 6 went to Bushy Park Stockyard to consolidate their knowledge of minibeasts and classification keys in science. They collected data by pond dipping and finding out all the different species that live in the



grounds of the stockyard. Each child took turns weaving the net in a figure of eight movement to collect the insects before carefully placing them in the containers so they could follow the key



and identify what they had captured. They saw pond snails, a ramshorn snail, freshwater shrimp, a dragonfly nymph, fleas, a fish, a hare worm, leeches, a damselfly nymph and many beetles.

Mrs Mullen said, "It was so much fun and completely reinforced what we had learned in autumn 1." Ariah-Mae agreed, "I liked working with my table to find all of the different animals. It was great fun using the nets and the key."

Anti-Bullying Week
