




## Stone Age Day


#### **Toy Workshop**

To play the game, players could only use their wrists and bodies (no hands, feet or head) to bounce a ball into a hoop. The person who won by

getting the ball into the hoop was sacrificed to please the gods, so if you lost, you actually won!"
