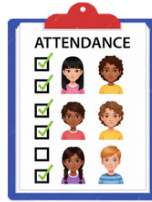

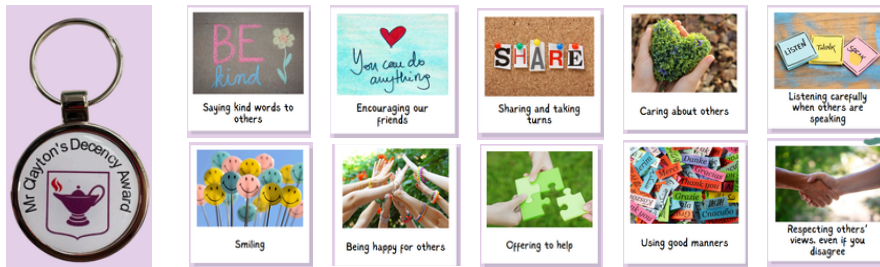

## NURSERY

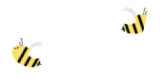

## MAGISTRATES VISIT YEAR 6

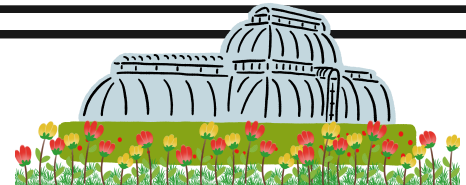

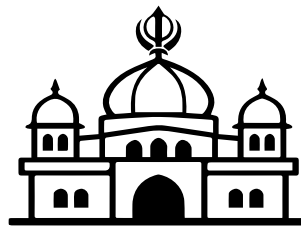
## YEAR 3 VISIT KEW GARDENS

## YEAR 4 GURDWARA TRIP

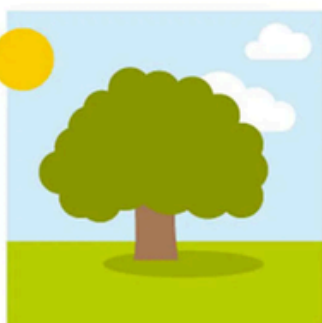

## CHILD SAFETY WEEK

During 'Child Safety Week' in the junior school, the children learnt about sun and water safety in an assembly by Miss Williams. In order to stay safe in the sun, the children learnt that in hot weather they should apply sun cream (at least factor 30 and above) and stay in the shade between 11am- 3pm. As well as this, in order to stay safe in water, the children learnt that they should never jump into open bodies of water, such as rivers or lakes, as they do not know what dangers lie underneath and how fast the current might be.

### How to enjoy the sun safely



#### Seek shade

Take a break under trees or umbrellas, especially in the middle of the day when the sun is strongest.



#### Cover up

Wear a top that covers your shoulders, a wide-brimmed hat and UV-protection sunglasses.



#### Apply sunscreen

Pick one with at least SPF 30 and 4 or 5 stars. Use it generously and regularly.

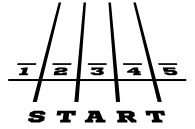

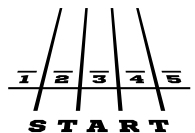
