Key vocabulary

guru	teacher
kirpan	a curved, single-edged sword or knife carried by Sikhs
kara	a steel or cast iron (sarb loh) bangle worn by Sikhs
kesh	the practice of allowing one's hair to grow naturally, out of respect
kanga	A small wooden comb
kachera	an undergarment for the lower body
sacred	connected with God (or the gods) or dedicated to a religious purpose
khalsa	'khalsa' means 'pure'. Joining the Khalsa community is a sign of commitment in Sikhism
