

Key vocabulary

Continent: Continents are large areas of land that cover the Earth's surface.

Country: An area of land.

Capital city: A city or town where the government of a county function.

Ocean: Oceans are vast areas of salty water. There are 5 Oceans that are all connected. The Oceans are the Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Arctic and Southern. 71% of the Earth is covered by salty water.

River: Rivers are large amounts of flowing fresh water that flow down hill towards oceans. Rivers often join together to make bigger rivers.

<u>Sea:</u> Seas are parts of oceans and are found in areas where the ocean and land meet.

Land: Land is the part of the Earth's surface not covered by water. It is solid. It includes islands and continents.

Countries: Countries are areas of land that are controlled by a single government.
