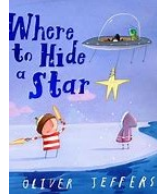

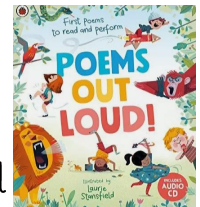

Where to hide a star.

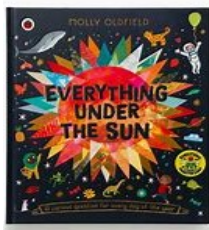

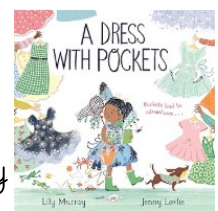

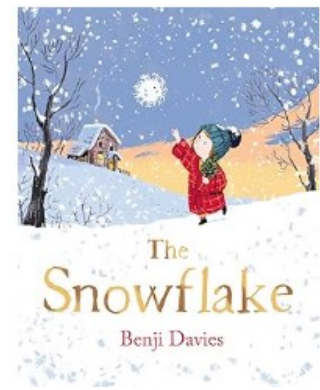
A dress with pockets by Lily Murray.

The Snowflake

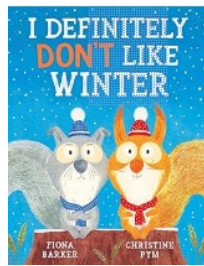

I definitely don't like Winter

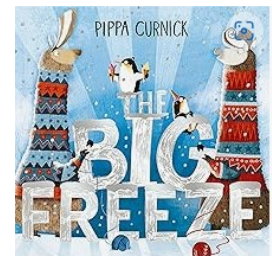

The big freeze

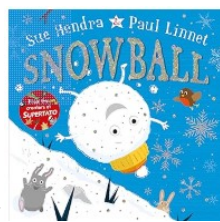

Snowball

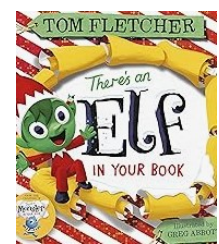
