In addition taking into consideration the young age of some of our pupils we intend to develop our children's enthusiasm to play and take regular activity outside through child led opportunities as well as offering adult led positive outdoor experiences at Forest School.

<b>PE Equipment for use at lunch break</b>	Replenish equipment regularly, further developing key fundamental skills.	£1,090.00	To encourage pupils love of outdoor sports activities away from formalised PE lessons or organised sports activities. Children develop a collaborative team approach and show each other new skills with the equipment provided.
<b>PE Kit for Teaching staff, consisting of polo shirt and sweatshirt</b>	This is to raise the profile of PE within the curriculum.
