Welcome back to the Summer term! We hope you all had a restful holiday!

We begin another busy and for some of us final school term, which is packed with wonderful new learning opportunities across the school. We are looking forward to working with you and your children so below is a summary of our curriculum for the Summer term. **Please note** that if your child is attending their mainstream class for subjects, you will find their year group curriculum bulletin on our school website, as the topics being studied may be different.

The Heathfield Way

'The Heathfield Way' underpins all that we do in school. We expect all members of the Heathfield community to:

- Learn and let others learn
- Respect all people and property
- Work hard and try their very best

When children follow, 'The Heathfield Way' they will be awarded house points, which are recorded in their reading diary.

English

This term in English we will begin by studying the text 'The Iron Man' to help us develop our creative writing skills, creating both insightful diaries as a range of characters and writing a comprehensive newspaper report. In the second part of the term, we will be reading the Picture Book 'Moth.' Using this text we will focus on non-fiction, writing around the subject and developing our factual writing skills. We will finish the Summer term by reading a range of poetry from differing authors and creating our own unique poems.

Maths

In maths we will be mastering a range of skills within the topics of: place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, measure, geometry and fractions. We will also cover areas such as measure, time, shape and statistics during the summer term. Please continue to work with your child on learning their times tables. This is extremely important as it supports their learning in a range of mathematical areas. All Year 4 children will complete the national Multiplication Tables Check in the summer term.



In order to help your children learn their times tables, the school remains a member of 'Times Table Rock Stars'. This is an online website where your children can practise their times tables through fun and interactive games.

Your child's login details are located at the front of the reading journal. We will be using this website in school but also ask that children login and practise at home as well.

Reading Diary

Reading and books are a huge part of our life at Heathfield. Therefore, all children are expected to read aloud to an adult at home **every** day for 20 minutes. After they have read, the children need to record the title of the book and comment about what they have read in their reading diary. An adult from home should then sign next to the comment. Your child's teacher will then read your child's comment and sign the reading diary too.

We understand that sometimes children find it hard to write a comment about what they have read so here are some ideas about what they might write about:

- What has happened in the book so far?
- Who is their favourite character and why?
- Who is their least favourite character and why?
- What they predict is going to happen next?

Science

Upper Applegate – This term we will be studying Evolution and Inheritance! Summer term.

Lower Applegate – This term we will be studying continuing to study Power It Up! (Electricity) during Summer 1 then Looking at states! in Summer 2.

In both terms we will be improving our scientific knowledge of both topics and improve our investigative skills through a range of practical experiments and experiences. A knowledge organiser will be published so that you can see an outline of the knowledge and skills your child will be taught in these topics.

Therapies

Occupational Therapy – OT will remain on a Tuesday and will include gross and fine motor sessions designed to improve our core strength, balance, coordination and improve our handwriting. We will also continue to develop our emotional regulation skills by creating more precise tool boxes to help when we are feeling over stimulated or overwhelmed. Sessions will also be built in to manage and support our sensory needs. Laura Harrison will remain as our therapist.

Speech and Language – SAL will remain on a Wednesday and will include groups involving some aspects of social thinking and self-advocacy as well as preparing ourselves for secondary school within Summer term. We will continue to work on our skills to engage our peers in conversation and continue our on social mapping and identifying our emotions and how this affects us and the world around us. Chelsea Long will remain as our therapist.

Homework

Homework is very important within school to help cement and embed our learning throughout the week and something we wish to continue progressing this year.

Lower Applegate – Spelling homework daily.

Upper Applegate – Spelling homework is set on a Thursday to be returned on the following Thursday.

If your child is attending mainstream English and/or Maths lesson, the homework will be set by their teacher on the days specified in their year group bulletin.
