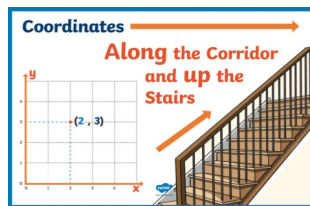

Co-ordinates

Coordinates are a set of numbers or letters together that show you a position on a map. They can help you find a specific place or

object that you are looking for.

Atlas: A collection of maps.

Capital cities: Where a country's government is located.

City: A large town.

Town: A built up area

Village: A group of houses and buildings, smaller than a town.

Equator: Imaginary line around the middle of the world.

Northern Hemisphere: Half of the earth north of the equator.

Southern Hemisphere: Half of the earth south of the equator.

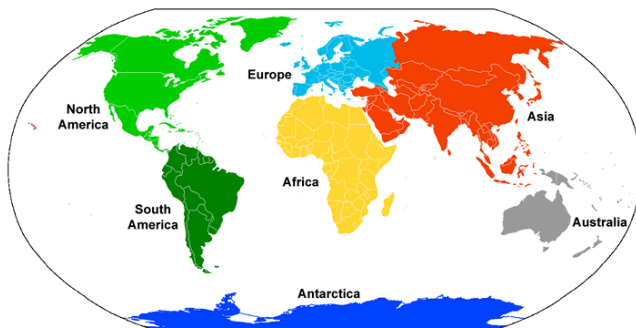
Compass: A tool for finding direction.

Coordinate: to find a particular point

Human feature: man made objects such as a bus stop or playground.

Physical feature: Natural features like seas and rivers.
