Key Art Vocabulary

Cross-hatching: A drawing technique that layers up lines to create different tones and made things look real

Proportion: How artists use the size of different things and links between height and width to make something look realistic.

Collage: The technique where paper, photographs, fabric and other materials are arranged and stuck together

Abstract art: does not attempt to show something in a realistic way. Uses shapes, colours and marks to achieve an effect

Self-portrait: a picture that an artist produced of themselves

Graffiti: writing or drawing that is highly stylistic and sprayed. Usually done on places or objects

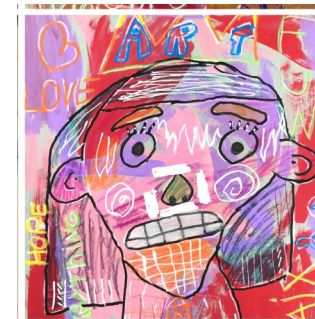
Jean-Michel Basquiat
