

# Provisional Key Stage 2 SATs Results 2024

### Cohort Profile

- 116 pupils (63 boys and 53 girls).
- 13% of pupils have an Educational, Health and Care Plan- EHC plan (on average 4.8% of primary school pupils have an EHC Plan)
- 19% of other pupils are registered as SEND support or have an additional need on the school's SEND register (on average 13% of primary school pupils have special educational needs (SEN) support, but don't have an EHC plan).
- 40% of the cohort are eligible for free school meals- FSM (on average 24.6% of pupils are eligible for FSM)

## <u>Science</u>

88% (National average 81%) of Year 6 pupils have made the expected standard in science.

### Scaled Scores

A scaled score of 100 represents the expected standard for each test. The highest scaled score possible is 120 and the lowest is 80. Pupils working at greater depth achieved a scales score of 110+.

The school's scaled score averages this year were: Reading: 106 (National Average: 105), Spelling Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG): 106 (National Average 105) and Maths: 106 (National Average: 104).

### Progress Measures 2023-202

As primary tests and assessments were cancelled in academic years 2019/20 and 2020/21 due to COVID-19 disruption, there will be no relevant KS1 data which is required to calculate primary progress measures for 2023/24 and 2024/25. Given the lack of a statistically robust alternative baseline to calculate primary progress measures, the DfE will not be producing or publishing primary progress measures for 2023/24 and 2024/25, and instead will only publish the usual attainment measures.
