

Pupil Premium is additional funding to help schools close the attainment gap between children from low income households (and other disadvantaged circumstances) and those of their peers. The funding is calculated by the number of children on the school roll registered for free school meals, children who are looked after or those whose parents are serving in the armed forces.

In the financial year 2018-19 the school received an additional £209,880 which contributed to the following provisions for PPG pupils:

- Additional daily teaching groups.
- Higher level Teaching Assistants to support intensive catch-up programmes.
- One to One Tuition.
- Volunteer Reading Scheme.
- Summer School.
- Extended school provision supporting social interaction and engagement.
