



Pupil Premium Overview: Heathfield Junior School

Pupil Premium is additional funding to help schools close the attainment gap between children from low income households (and other disadvantaged circumstances) and those of their peers. The funding is calculated by the number of children on the school roll registered for free school meals, children who are looked after or those whose parents are serving in the armed forces.

The table below shows the additional funding the school received in the last three academic years to provide provisions for PPG pupils:

2018-2019	£209,880
2019-2020	£180,000
2020-2021	£215,000

This additional funding has been used to provide the following provisions:

- Additional daily teaching groups
- Higher Level Teaching Assistants to support intensive catch-up programme
- One to one tuition
- Daily fruit scheme
- Volunteer reading scheme
- Summer School
- Emotional and mental health support
- Extended school provision supporting social interaction and engagement.
