Asymptomatic Testing for Essential Workers



Richmond Borough Residents

ALL residents in the borough who are either essential workers, volunteering, providing vital support for a vulnerable resident, or need regular reassurance that they don't have COVID-19, can now apply for a rapid COVID-19 test; this test is for people NOT experiencing symptoms or asymptomatic.

We know that up to one in three people who have coronavirus never show any symptoms but that does not mean they are not infectious. Lateral flow devices (LFDs) are one of the tools being used to help us to detect and fight COVID-19.

These tests can allow individuals with no symptoms to check if they have the virus, when they otherwise wouldn't know, and make sure they are not putting others at risk. The rapid turnaround, lateral flow tests – which can give results in under an hour, without the need for laboratory processing.

The Council would like to offer these tests to essential workers, including those who work in supermarkets, taxi or mini cab drivers, transport staff, those who work in key public services or in faith-based organisations. In addition, residents who are volunteering or providing care for a vulnerable person can also apply.

If you are NOT displaying any COVID-19 symptoms and need a test, go to:

If your rapid test result is positive you must take a confirmatory PCR test as soon as possible after your result and must self isolate immediately for 10 days.
